MEMBERSHIP DRIVE CONT'D FROM) PAGE 1

Article VI - Priv.of Members.

(1) Only paid members will have the right to exercise the privileges of the Rostone Recreational Association, with the exception of the Rostone Corporation sponsored picnic.

Any member, or members, of the Association shall have the privilege of petitioning the Board of Directors in writing on any matter pertaining to the activities, welfare, or satisfactory function of the Association.

Participation in sports or activities is entirely subject to the control of the Association. Any activity, in order to receive the support of the Association and represent the company in any way, must have the sanction of the Board of Directors, which will then make a financial allotment at their discretion.

The Board of Directors shall hold regular monthly meetings. The time of these meetings may vary from month to month, but it is to be posted on bulletin boards so that each department is notified.

- (1) At present the departments are grouped as such:
- I. Mixing & Pressing
 - II. Conditioning & Induration
 - III. Finishing
 - IV. Packing
 - V. Maintenance & Die Shop
 - VI. Inspection
 - VII. Rostone & Shower Stalls
 - VIII. Office Employees & Lab
 - IX. Management

(1) Office employees & Lab are entitled to elect two (2) directors, if 10 or over members are employed. They are eligible to hold an office. (1) Management is entitled to elect two (2) directors, if ten (10) or over are employed.

They are not eligible to hold an office.

At a later date we will furnish each member with a complete copy of the Constitution and by laws.

Each month a complete financial statement is published in this paper, and posted on the plant bulletin board.

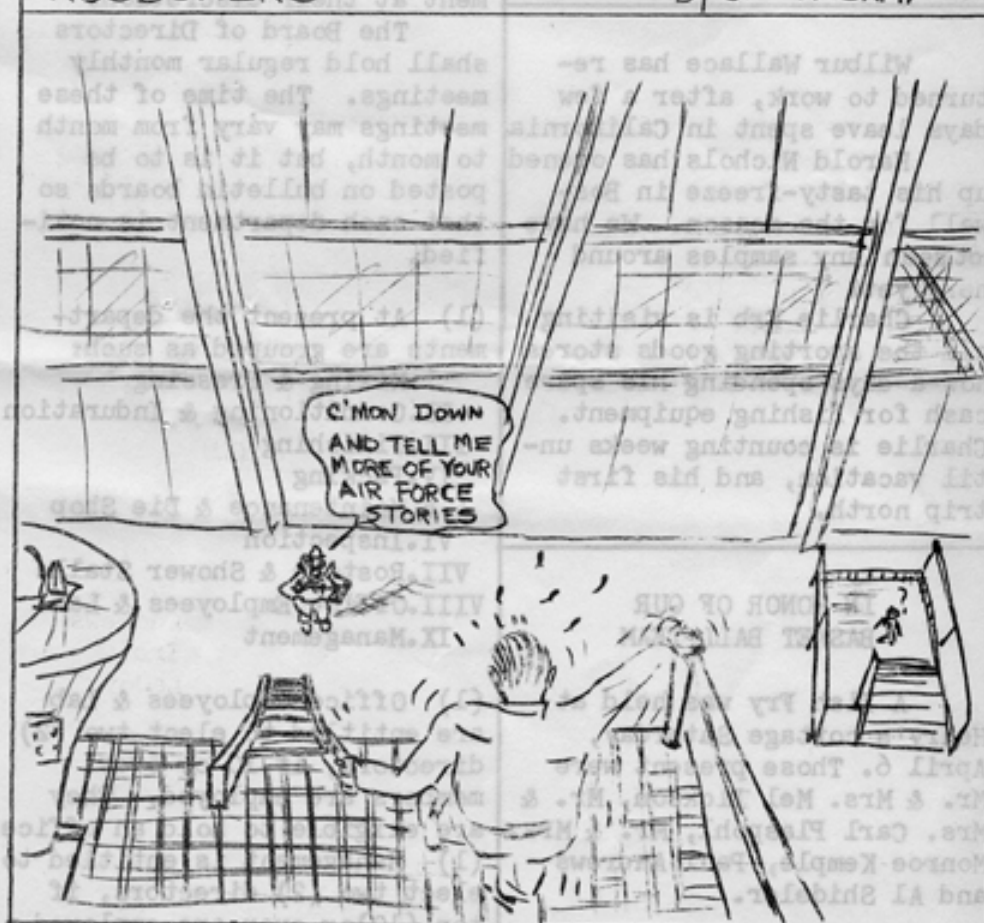
